☐ It's Official: Print your Instructor Certificate here: <u>SAR - Student Air Rifle Program - BARI Manager</u> (sarinstructor.org)
☐ Help SAR Improve: Visit https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/JPKCCFH to submit a short survey to help us improve the training experience. Your input is important!
■ Keep in Touch: Create a user account at <u>SARinstructor.org</u> using the <i>Help/Resources</i> tab as your guide. This is where you will go for annual reporting and updating personal information. You can also print a copy of your training certificate. Keeping your contact information accurate and up to date is critical so we can reach you.
☐ Get Started: Familiarize yourself with the <u>SAR Website</u> and how to <u>order equipment</u> and supplies. Grants are available, but the process often takes months so don't delay.
Know Your Contacts: Each state has a <u>State Coordinator</u> to use as your first point of contact for help. SAR's Instructor Manager, Tamie St. John, is also a source for assistance: <u>Tamie@studentairrifleprogram.org</u> .
☐ Shoot for Success! Instruct using the guidelines you learned during your BARI training to facilitate an introduction to target shooting, keep it safe and relevant, and promote the shooting sports through positive youth development. Refer to the SAR Basic Air Riflery Instructor Guide .
☐ Stay Informed: Be on the lookout for periodic BARI Newsletters for news and information important to your position including tournament and grant opportunities.
☐ Share Successes: Follow us on social media. Submit short text and photos to share good news to SAR Marketing Manager, Macy Wolf for publishing. Macy@studentairrifleprogram.org .
□ Report, Report: Keep track of your courses and students to make sure reporting is complete by August 31 annually. Remember you have to teach/coach at least 10 hours of SAR annually, and report, to keep your certification active.Go to <u>SARinstructor.org/report</u>
☐ Grow and Compete: Look for opportunities to host tournaments between your local schools or school districts. Consider coordinating resources to plan a state tournament, and develop a team to participate in the annual National Championship held in Missouri in October each year.
